The Mikra Memorial is in the Mikra British Cemetery and it commemorates almost 500 nurses, officers and men of the Commonwealth forces who died when troop transports and hospital ships were lost in the Mediterranean, and who have no grave but the sea. They are commemorated here because others who went down in the same vessels were washed ashore and identified, and are now buried at Thessalonika. Charles Green was on the HT "Arcadian" was torpedoed and sunk on 15 April 1917, 41.5 kilometres north east from the island of Milo (Melos), carrying reinforcements for Egypt.

HMS Arcadian

Charles Reginald Green who was born in Colwall and baptised there on 26th October 1890, was the son of James and Mary Green. James Green was a bricklayer. Charles was one of thirteen children. By 1911 Charles was a domestic groom working for Albert Pedlingham who was a farmer at Bryn Bella, Colwall Green. He enlisted in Hereford and joined the Royal Army Medical Corps. He was on *HMS Arcadian*, which was carrying reinforcements for Egypt, when she was torpedoed and sunk in the Aegean Sea. He is commemorated on the Mikra Memorial Greece
